SHAVUOT: EMBRACING A LIFE OF TORAH LISHMAH



In a few weeks we will be celebrating the festival of Shavuot. Shavuot is one of our most important holidays because it celebrates the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai and asks us to think about the role that Torah plays in our daily lives. Unfortunately, between the end of the school year for families, anticipation of Memorial Day which brings us closer to our beloved days on the beach, and the actual start of Summer, Shavuot tends to get lost in the shuffle of our busy lives (especially when, as it does this year, it falls just before Memorial Day weekend!). The challenge is that when we let Shavuot slip through our fingers, when we do not make time to recognize, celebrate, and live out the values of this holiday, we miss an opportunity to re-affirm and re-engage with an essential moment in the Jewish Festival cycle.

We miss an opportunity to re-commit ourselves to Jewish learning, to Torah, which literally means "instruction."

Shavuot is the holiday of learning, of study. Shavuot is the holiday when we are reminded that the words of Torah should, as we say each day, always "be on our hearts." It is the holiday when we are reminded of the commandment to teach Judaism to our children and grandchildren – speaking of them when we are at home, when we travel, when we lie down and when we rise up (Deuteronomy 6)." We cannot do this, of course, if we do not take the time to study, to learn, to open up our hearts and minds in curiosity to the ancient spiritual wisdom of our people. One ancient Hassidic teaching taught that the words have to first be on our hearts (and minds), continuously, through openness, learning, and practice, before they will eventually seep into our hearts.

"But we are too busy, to study Torah," we say. "We wouldn't know where to start," we explain. "Torah study doesn't have anything to say to us," we assume (often based on our recollections from a poor Hebrew school education many years ago).

This year, I want to encourage us to use Shavuot as an opportunity to re-engage in some type of Jewish learning, of *Torah Lishmah* (Torah study for its own sake) in our lives. One opportunity might be to join us on Thursday night, May 25, as we enjoy a community Shavuot service (6:30pm) and dinner (7:00pm), followed by an evening of study (ending by 9:00pm). Look for more information in the coming weeks and please bring a friend. If you cannot make it, or even if you can, here are a list of seven different ways (one for each week that we just counted from Passover to Shavuot) that you might engage in the study of Torah this year. I encourage you to check each of them out, pick one place that seems to interest you, and get started.

- 1. Pick up the Torah and start reading. Start with one chapter each day and see where it takes you. Everyone should own a copy of the *Etz Hayim Humash* in their home as it is a wonderful resource.
- 2. Sign up for an adult education class at the synagogue or in the community.
- 3. Sign up for a Jewish course on-line. The Jewish Theological Seminary is one institution that offers some fabulous courses taught by Seminary scholars. You can also check out the American Jewish University, Shalom Hartman Institute, The Conservative Yeshivah in Jerusalem, or Mechon Hadar in NY. Email me for a list of Jewish podcasts if you enjoy learning in that way. The opportunities are endless.
- 4. Go to the bookstore and buy a Jewish book that looks interesting to you, bring it to the beach this summer, and begin discussing it with family and friends.
- 5. Visit our library and check out some of our wonderful resources through our on-line library catalog.
- 6. Come to Shabbat services and engage in our weekly Torah learning.
- 7. Write down a list of Jewish questions or topics that you have always wanted to learn about and think about how to begin studying one of these topics. As always, I am happy to help you get started with this journey. Feel free to call me or e-mail for any advice or to go out for breakfast, coffee, or lunch so we can learn together.

There is no question that this is a tall order. Jewish study often leaves us with more questions than answers, but that is a good thing because these questions can end up enriching our lives in profound ways. A commitment to Jewish learning, a commitment to receiving Torah in our lives, takes much dedication and is an endless pursuit. But it is also an endless privilege. Each time we return the Torah to the ark we chant, "Etz Hayim He" and we are reminded that the Torah is a tree of life to us, **but only if we hold onto it.** This Shavuot, may each of us re-commit ourselves to taking hold of Torah, of Jewish learning; always remembering to cherish it, study it, and incorporate its teachings into our lives each and every day.



MAZEL TOV TO OUR BAT MITZVAH - ALANA MALEK


