PRESENCE AS A SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE



We often have a debate in our family about whether or not multi-tasking is something that people can actually do effectively. Admittedly, I am not very good at focusing on more than one thing at a time. If I am doing work on the computer, I can't be watching TV at the same time. If you are trying to talk to me, and I am on my phone, I am not really paying attention to you. I may register what you are saying to me, but I am not really taking it in. If I am cooking dinner, and one of my children needs help with homework, either something gets burned, or someone doesn't get helped! "What do you mean?" you may be thinking. "I can do more than one thing at once, and I can do them both well! I have even changed clothes, or put on makeup in the car while driving!"

Well, it turns out that while many of us may think that we are excellent multi-taskers, there is at least *some* scientific data that does not support our belief. In an article that I read a few years ago written by Jon Hamilton, a science reporter for NPR, entitled *Think You're Multitasking? Think Again*, neurologist Earl Miller, a professor at MIT explains that:

People can't multi-task very well, and when people say they can, they're deluding themselves," "The brain is very good at deluding itself." What we can do, he said, is shift our focus from one thing to the next with astonishing speed. "Switching from task to task, you think you're actually paying attention to everything around you at the same time. But you're actually not," "You're not paying attention to one or two things simultaneously, but switching between them very rapidly..." For early humans, that sort of miscalculation could have meant becoming a tiger's lunch. These days, the consequences are more likely to be stress, a blunder, or maybe a car crash.

What does all of this have to do with our Jewish lives? It turns out, quite a bit because there are spiritual pitfalls that come along with trying to multi-task as well. Last month we celebrated the Festival of Shavuot, commemorating the revelation of the Torah on Mount Sinai. The Torah tells us that when God asked Moses to come up the mountain, God said:

Come up to Me on the mountain **and be there (v'heyeh sham)**, and I will give you the stone tablets with the teachings and commandments which I have inscribed to instruct them." **Exodus 24:12**

Why the redundancy here? Why the seemingly unnecessary phrase "and be there?" Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Kotzk explains that this seemingly superfluous phrase is necessary because it is proof that:

a person can exert tremendous effort to reach the top of a mountain, yet without being there. He may be standing on the mountain, but his head may be elsewhere. *The main thing is not the ascent, but being there,* and only there, and not to be below at the same time. **Rabbi Menahem Mendel of Kotzk, 1787-1859**

In other words, God was reminding Moses that it was not enough to climb up the mountain to receive the Torah; God wanted Moses to be present in that moment. God was reminding Moses not to be distracted by the people waiting for him, by their concerns, or by anything that he forgot at the bottom of the mountain!

If distraction during revelation was a concern for Moses, how much more is this a challenge for each of us in our daily lives and our daily interactions? As Rabbi Edwin Goldberg explains:

To "be there" in the everyday happenings in life is no small task. So often we are mired in the past, in consideration of what we did or didn't do. Or we are anxious about the future. So often we are physically with someone but mentally off in another world, and an opportunity for true communication is squandered... to focus on the present is a great spiritual challenge...

As we get into these months of summer, and hopefully find some down time along the beautiful Jersey shore, I want to invite us to consider taking on the practice of being more present throughout our daily lives. If you are blessed to be sitting on the beach with loved ones, enjoying some time outdoors with family and friends, or just having a different "summer" pace, may you take the opportunity to pause the climbing, the constant forward motion, reminding yourselves of the sacred moments that can be discovered when we allow ourselves to stand still on the mountain, awake and aware of the ordinary moment that is actually "extraordinary." May each of us be blessed with the inner strength and awareness to remain present throughout our daily interactions, as we strive to create a world of inner peace, tranquility, and awareness. Installation Speech From Our New President, Michelle Winters

A brief bio of my Jewish journey that has led me to this day. I am a heritage Beth El member and have been a temple member for 54 years.
