IN SEARCH OF THE LIGHT



A story is told of a king and queen who had three children. As they were getting older, the royal couple wanted to ensure that one of their children would be chosen to lead in their stead one day. The challenge was, that they loved each of their children equally and were not sure who to choose. One day, they devised a "test" to see which child would have the proper skills to rule the kingdom when the time came. The king and queen called their three children into the room and explained that there was one huge room in the palace that was big and empty and never used. They told their children that whichever one of them "filled the room the most," would become first to rule the kingdom after their death. Each child had 30 days to fill the room to its fullest potential. The oldest son thought that he had it all figured out. He decided to fill the room with

stones – big stones, pebbles, anything to "fill the room." After 30 days the king and queen went to check out their oldest son's handy work. The room was full, but there were still tiny spaces between the rocks. The parents told their oldest that they were so proud of him, had the room cleared, and turned to the middle child. The middle child decided to do something different. He thought that if he filled the room with feathers, it would surely fill up. After all, feathers can be compressed. After 30 days the king and queen again came to check out this son's handywork. When they opened the door to the room, feathers started flying out. "Great job," they exclaimed. "But there are still some spaces that are yet to be filled." Finally, it was time for the third child to have a turn. She was eagerly awaiting her chance, but decided to spend a few weeks thinking about what to do. The brothers wanted to help their sister out because each of them were trying to be supportive of the other. Finally, on day 29, the daughter had an idea. When the king and queen entered the room, they both smiled. In the center of the room was their daughter, holding a lit candle in her hand. She had filled the room with light! "Our precious daughter, you have what it takes to rule this kingdom with thoughtfulness and wisdom. When the time comes, you will be our next ruler."

Hanukkah is called *Hag Ha-Urim,* the Festival of Lights. It has always fascinated me that the main focus of Hanukkah, particularly in the Diaspora, has revolved around the ritual of lighting candles. Why did a holiday celebrating a military victory of the Maccabees over the Hasmoneans, and the rededication of the Temple, turn into a home holiday focused on the lighting of lights that were to be proudly displayed in the window for all to see? Part of the lesson here is that historically speaking, all odds were stacked against Judah and the Macabees, who should not have been able to defeat the mighty Assyrian army as they fought for religious freedom. Nevertheless, despite the odds and the darkness that surrounded them at the time, they survived and went on to squeeze out the tiniest bit of oil and light that was physically and spiritually left over, to bring forth a light that would continue to shine for generations to come.

Thus Hanukkah, and the *Hanukkiah* that we light and publicize is meant to remind us of both the oil, and the battle – becoming a symbol of hope, light, and overcoming darkness.

As I write these words, Israel is still at war and the anti-Semitism that we have seen in this country, on college campuses, and around the world is more than unsettling. As we approach this coming Hanukkah, let us do so remembering never to despair and never to lose hope. Let us remember that we can be that light that fills up the darkness and emptiness that sometimes surrounds us. As we explain Israel's right to defend itself and defend the Jewish people to the world, let us remember that wisdom from one tenth-century Jewish philosopher, Bahya Ibn Paquda, who once taught that "A little truth overcomes much falsehood, as a little light dispels much darkness." Let us look for stories and examples of light, and hope, and heroism even in these dark times, reminding ourselves that there is goodness in the world, there is light, and not everyone "is against us" (even if it sometimes feels that way). And then, as we consider the Hanukkiyah, and the Shamash (the helper candle), let us strive to be the kind of people who bring light into the darkness, who fill the empty rooms in this world with our own special light.

This year, as we set our *Hanukkiyot* in our window for public display, proud of our Judaism and the light for which it stands, let us remember the power of this ancient symbol and practice. This Hanukkah, as we support our Israeli brothers and sisters, as we support one another, as we support our Jewish and non-Jewish friends and family during these difficult days, let us never forget our power to share the light, to be the light, and to hope in the light that will push away the darkness.

With prayers for better days ahead and a reminder that our people is very much still here, and filled with light, I wish you all a Happy Hanukkah.

Dear Friends,

As the war in Israel rages on, tensions remain high at home and abroad, as anti-Semitism is on the rise and around every corner. Here at the synagogue we continue to balance our needs for safety with our values of being warm and welcoming. At times we may feel leery to speak to someone we do not know, to offer them a seat next to ours, to let them into our building.

The security guard you see on Shabbat and special events is funded by the generous donations received in response to the optional security request on your July statement. The cost for this service is approximately \$20,000 per year. However, as you know, the synagogue is not just open for Shabbat services and special events. We are open seven days a week, and at any given time, there are staff, congregants, and students here. Our operating budget does not allow for an armed guard on our premises during all of these hours. We have estimated that it would be an additional \$100,000 per year for such coverage.

We all realize even an armed guard is not enough. There are numerous ways to make our building more secure. The term "target hardening" encompasses myriad additions, updates and improvements to keep all of us safe, regardless of the time of day, or how many of us are here.

Based on recommendations following a site visit from state and local law enforcement, our Board of Trustees itemized and prioritized our most urgent security needs:

- Bulletproof/shatterproof glass film on all doors and windows \$45,000
- Enhanced camera system, cloud-based for police viewing in real-time, better visuals and zoom capabilities, license plate reader \$35,000
- Installation of security door at entrance of School Wing with staff-only access \$20,000
- Update antiquated burglar alarm system \$12,500

Unfortunately, we were not amongst the recipients chosen to receive funding from the most recent round of Homeland Security Grants.

To that end, on behalf of your Board of Trustees and staff, I am left with the unenviable task of asking for your support once again. We know that many of you contributed to the original security request. We know many of you are making significant donations directly to Israel. We will continue to apply for Homeland Security Funding as it becomes available, but the risks, threats and fear are real and they are now.

We are asking you to be as generous as you can. These items are all costly, but necessary to mitigate any potential risks against our synagogue and our community. If you've already responded to this plea with a donation please accept our sincere thanks.




