MEMBERS OF THE TRIBE



As I write these words we are one week into a very dark and challenging period in Jewish history with the war between Israel and Gaza just beginning to unfold. I am certain that by the time you are reading this, things will have changed in ways that none of us can yet imagine. Lately, this war, and the fact that we find ourselves beginning the book of Genesis in our Torah reading cycle, has me thinking a lot about what it means to be a part of the Jewish people in particular, and what it means to be a part of humanity as a whole. As this war unfolds, I find myself immediately drawn to the message of standing in complete solidarity with the State of Israel and the Jewish people during such difficult days. The collective wound that is thousands of years of anti-Semitism and trauma has been opened in such a way that my instinct is to immediately connect with Jews who understand this moment in a very particular way. In both virtual space, and “real” space, I find myself needing to be present with “members of the tribe,” during these difficult days. And I know that I am not alone. It is no accident that just days after the terror of Simchat Torah, with little to no notice, well over one hundred people gathered in our sanctuary for a moment of solidarity. We had a primal instinct to be together. I know that instinct has been present in all sorts of ways during these past few weeks.

At the same time, as someone who believes that everyone, regardless of religious beliefs, cultural background, political persuasion, is made in the image of God, I find myself struggling a bit with this “tribal” instinct and wondering how we balance the urgency and devastation of the moment with our collective responsibilities towards the people in our lives, and around the world, with whom we share the universal privilege of being a part of one human family.

All of this calls to mind a book that I read years ago (I know, that is surprising!) written by Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, entitled *Not in God's Name (Confronting Religious Violence)*. In it, Sacks took a closer look at the stories in the book of Genesis and reminded his readers that while the book of Genesis contains our particular story, it begins with the universal creation of humanity. What’s more, Sacks notes that throughout Genesis, as a reader, we are continually feeling empathy for those who are not members of the Israelite tribe (Adam, Eve, Cain, Abel, Noah, Esau, Hagar and Ishmael). As Rabbi Sacks explains:

The Torah is a particular text, but it begins with the universals of the human condition... Judaism is built on a dual structure. It has a universal dimension and particularistic one, neither of which negates the other. God has a general relationship with all humanity and a particular relationship with the Children of Israel... Future Tense, 211-212

In other words, as we return to the book of Genesis yet again, we are being reminded of our sacred challenge and task to hold on to both the particular and the universal – especially in times like this. But which deserves our attention first? The Talmud asks this very question in tractate Bava Metzia (71) when Rav Yosef explains that if a Jew and a non-Jew come to you asking for money, you give to the Jew first. If a poor Jew and a poor gentile come to you asking for money, you give to the poor Jew first. If you have to choose between the poor of your city and the poor of another city, your city takes precedence. This might sound antiquated, and even offensive to our modern ears. But notice that the text does not say to avoid giving to the person who is not Jewish, or in your own town – it simply reminds us to “take care of our own” – first.

Today, as I write these words, we are focused on our own tribe. We are focused on the Jewish people, and our friends and family who have joined us in standing up against the evil that is Hamas and Hezbollah. Many of us, quite naturally (and I would argue correctly) are focused on supporting Israel and defending her right to defend herself. We are focused on combatting the ignorance and hatred directed towards Jews all over the world, found prominently on college campuses around this country. We are struggling to place our empathy elsewhere.

But in this moment, and especially when this moment is over, our Torah and tradition reminds us that we must try to both vigorously defend and stand with our people, while remembering that the whole world is not actually against us (some people are simply ignorant). When all of this is over, will we be able to support the right of Israel to live as a free Jewish and democratic state, alongside any reasonable and creative efforts to work towards peace with the Palestinians? Will we be able to re-connect with friends, family, and co-workers who we feel simply do not understand what this moment is about for the Jewish people? Will we be able to show empathy towards those who we feel have not shown us the support that we need in this moment? This will be no easy task. It is difficult to write about (which is why I am writing about it). But as the book of Genesis reminds us, since the beginning of time, we have been called upon to never give up hope, and always to strive working to see God’s presence both in the particular cause of our people, and in the more general shared experience of our common humanity. May we yet see the day when this becomes possible again, and during these impossible times, may we keep our aching, angry, and fearful hearts open enough to, one day, help make it so.

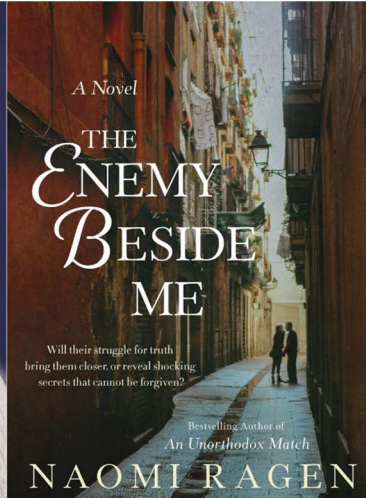

annihilation of its Jewish population, but has also continued to honor mass murderers.

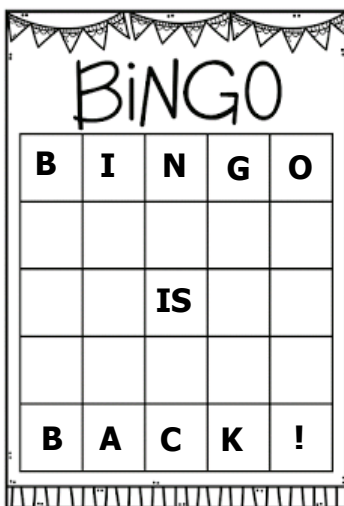
