HOW TO SAY GOODBYE - A FINAL LESSON FROM A MASTER TEACHER



I was as shocked as anyone when I got the call. A friend of mine who is a rabbi in Beverly, Massachusetts called me to tell me that our former Cantor, Bruce Siegel, was critically ill and nearing the end of his life. There is no easy way to share this news with someone, but she did it with grace and kindness and I was so appreciative that she let me know. Since his retirement, Cantor Siegel and I kept in touch periodically over the years, though we had not spoken in quite some time. Knowing that he had given permission for the news to be public, I called him up to tell him that I was thinking about him, as well as Anne and the rest of the family.

In the coming week or two, he and I played "phone tag," until eventually, we connected.

What happened next was something I will never forget.

It was one of those moments when you know you are experiencing something important, something life changing. It was the moment when our beloved Cantor, Bruce Siegel, who was not only a Cantor but a wonderful teacher to so many of us, taught me one last lesson. As all of you know, I am not a stranger to conversations about death and dying. I am very familiar with the experience of being present with families during a loved one's final days. But it is rare that I encounter someone who is physically and emotionally able to so clearly express their feelings towards the end of their life. It is rare that someone so lovingly and explicitly is gifted with the ability and emotional strength to say "goodbye" to those who will be left behind.

Cantor Siegel called me right before Shabbat. It was quiet in the house (which rarely happens) and just before I had to start getting ready to head to synagogue. It had been a terrible week in Israel – the first week after the attacks; I was exhausted; and the phone rang. It was Cantor Siegel. He sounded tired, but in good spirits. He called, he said, to thank me for being his friend, and "his teacher." Truly, I am not sure why he thanked me, or what I could have possibly taught him – a master teacher, who gave me, who gave all of us, so much. I told him what he meant to us, to our congregation, and how appreciative we were for all that he taught us. I told him that his Torah reading program still lives on through the incredible work of Ben Laskowitz. I told him that his students still talk about his wonderful adult education classes. I reminded him about what he and Anne meant to our congregation. I asked him how he was doing. He said that he was doing okay and that this moment was "just a late payment on a life full of blessings." He continued:

"I got the better end of the deal. It was important to call you to say goodbye. To thank you for all that you did for me and my family. Do me a favor, he asked, give your family a big hug for me. They are such wonderfully special people. Tell the congregation that they are such a big part of my life and I am forever grateful to them. I (just) wanted to say thank you so much and keep on truckin'. Don't worry about me," he said. "I'm fine. I'm just waiting for the curtain to come down." (Leave it to Bruce to use a performance metaphor, even towards the end). "Josh (his son)," he said, "Is doing really well. He is a real mensch and has been a real rock. Just tell people that I miss them and how special they were, and are. Tell them that they were the dream and the congregation was the dream. I was so lucky. I learned so much from working with you. I'll be fine, really just a late payment on a life full of blessing."


HOW TO SAY GOODBYE - A FINAL LESSON FROM A MASTER TEACHER

I was crying. He was crying. And I immediately wrote down what he said to me because I wanted to remember this tremendous gift and I knew that I would eventually want to share his example with others. In that moment, Cantor Siegel showed such strength. During his final days, Cantor Siegel was able to leave this world filled with gratitude and the ability to express that gratitude. How many people get the chance, and have the ability to do that?

And here's the kicker – he didn't just do this for me. I know he started making calls and doing this for so many people, for some who may be reading this reflection.

Why share this with you? I do so for two reasons. First, if you have someone in your life who is near the end of their life (or you are in this place yourself), don't wait to tell a friend or a loved one what they mean to you. Don't wait to say goodbye. Take a moment to have the serious conversation. Contrary to our Jewish sense of superstition, it will not influence the outcome of the death that will come eventually. The gift that you will give, and the comfort that you will receive will be well worth the emotional vulnerability. Second, even if you do not find yourself in this position, even if you are healthy and well, make sure that you take some time to tell your closest friends and family what they mean to you. Not everyone gets that chance, and not everyone is wise enough to take it. Say something, write something, find a way to express to your loved ones how much they mean to you today. Don't wait.

Our sages taught that *devarim she-yotzim min ha-lev, nichnasim ba-lev,* things that come straight out of the heart, go straight into the heart. As we find ourselves at the beginning of a new secular year, may we be wise enough to move forward with an open heart, telling our loved ones how much they mean to us, even, and especially, in the most impossible of moments. May the memory of our beloved Cantor Bruce Siegel, *He Chazan Dov Tzvi Ben Yaakov Eliyahu V'Chaya Rivka,* be forever a blessing. I will forever be grateful for my final lesson from my friend, and our teacher.

Lisa will share her experience with us through her talk and a slide show.




