POUR OUT YOUR WRATH - HOW THE END OF THE SEDER MIGHT SPEAK TO US THIS



When I was a young boy celebrating Passover, I always enjoyed the moment that we headed towards the end of the seder. The wonderful Hebrew songs, the search for the afikomen, and of course, waiting with bated breath to see if Elijah had come in to drink from the cup of wine! Many are familiar with this custom of opening the door and singing for Elijah the prophet – the one who is supposed to come to announce the ultimate redemption and a world finally at peace. We like to sing, and maybe kick the table to make the cup move as we engage the young kids around the table. What may be less familiar to us is the paragraph that is found in the Hagaddah and recited just as we open the door.

Pour out your wrath upon the nations that do not know You and on the regimes that have not called upon Your name. For Jacob is devoured; they have laid his places to waste. Pour out Your great anger upon them and let Your blazing fury overtake them. Pursue them in Your fury and destroy them from under the heavens of the Lord.
(Psalms 79,69, Lamentations 3)

This passage of vengeance, traditionally understood to be a cry out to God, was not found in the earliest Haggadot. It was added during the Middle ages, as the Jews were facing persecution and accusations of blood libel during the Crusades. It was as if families would open the door and say: *"look, no blood at this seder table," and by the way God, please do something about our enemies!"* Indeed the concerns about blood libel during the middle ages were so great that special dispensation was given by some religious authorities to drink white wine, instead of red at the seder. (Sacks, Pesach Haggadah, 121) Jews are not a vengeful people. The Torah tells us not to hate our enemy or bear a grudge, but this paragraph comes close and lands differently this year.

As with all of the other holidays since October 7th, this year I am finding that my experience is colored by our current circumstance. How can it not be? Normally, I try to explain this "text of wrath" away by either skipping it, or thinking about the hopeful part of creating a better world that comes along with evoking Elijah the prophet. But this year, I find myself gravitating towards this text – filled with anger at those who would seek to destroy the state of Israel, who chant "from the river to the sea" (often without knowledge of which river or sea), and who have created toxic atmospheres of anti-Semitism filled with hate, ignorance and rage on college campuses and well beyond.

And yet, at the same time, even as I notice my increased anger and fear, this year, I am reminded the counterbalance that is found in other Passover rituals and places in the Haggadah. As I dip my finger in the wine this year, I will be thinking with pride about the brave men and women of the IDF who have fought to defend the state of Israel these past months, and I will simultaneously remind myself that pride is not the same thing as joy. Even if we are filled with anger, we must not lose our humanity. No one is happy about this war that we did not ask for, even if many of us think that it is necessary for the survival of the nation state of Israel. It is okay to be upset about the loss of life during this war, even as we defend Israel's right to wage it.

Second, we are to challenge ourselves to somehow bring the best of our Jewish faith into the darkness of this moment. As Rabbi Gordon Tucker points about this text of wrath:

The expression of rage at brutality suffered by our people is not out of place. It is natural, and does no good when it is kept in. But there is one more crucial element in this cathartic moment that must not be missed. For the anger, to which we give expression, is placed just before the third psalm of Hallel: "Not for us Adonai, not for us, but rather for the glory of your name (Psalm 115)..." as we absorb, not only October 7th, but also the war in the ensuing months, (this juxtaposition) conveys a very weighty and timely message. We are given leave to express our wrath at what the pre-messianic world can mete out, *but then we are immediately reminded that the anger must translate itself into acts that are not about our aggrandizement or felt need for revenge, but solely to further the kind of world that gives testimony to Gods' presence and purposes (Creditor, Prouser, "Seder Interrupted: A Post October 7th Passover Supplement, 104)*

In other words, of course we can be angry, but we are to channel that anger in ways that will make the world a better place, a more beautiful place, a sacred place worthy of God's presence. That is our challenge this year as we rise to open the door for Elijah, filled with rage, and fear, struggling to hold onto our humanity and become living symbols of goodness and hope. May we never lose the aspiration of this moment in our seder, as a people who always chooses life, love and the belief that redemption is possible, even as we are filled with righteous and understandable anger.

L'Shanah Ha'ba'ah Beyerushalayim. Next year, May Jerusalem and all of Israel know peace.

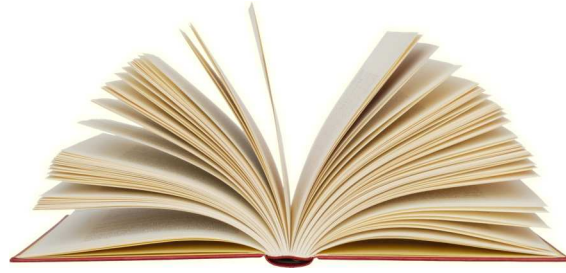
