AN EMOTIONAL RIDE THROUGH "THE YOM'S"



As we continue to work our way through the Jewish calendar, in the midst of celebrating Passover, we find ourselves heading towards, what I affectionately refer to as "the Yom's." *Yom Hashoah*, Holocaust Memorial Day; *Yom Hazikaron*, Israel's Memorial Day; and *Yom Ha'atzmaut*, Israel's Independence Day. *Yom Hashoah*, observed on the 27th of Nisan, just one week after the conclusion of Passover and one week before Yom Hazikaron, was a date chosen by the Knesset in 1951. While discussions surrounding just when and how to commemorate the atrocities of the Holocaust were varied, this date was chosen as it marked the beginning of the

Warsaw Ghetto Uprising in 1943. From this choice we see that since the very beginning of our observance of Holocaust Memorial Day, there was a connection between commemorating the tremendous loss of our people, and recalling our resilience.

The mix of emotions felt during these days in the Jewish calendar has always been intense, from the losses recalled in the Shoah, to the losses recalled in defense of the modern State of Israel, to the jubilation at the existence of a modern, independent, democratic and Jewish State, these weeks are filled with emotion. This is particularly true, at least in my lifetime, this year.

As I write these words, I have just returned from an intense and incredibly meaningful journey to Israel. As we head towards these emotionally full "Yom's," I want to share one small memory with you from my journey. We had just finished visiting the site of the Nova Festival memorial, where 4400 young adults of a variety of backgrounds had gone to dance and party through the night in an open field (think Woodstock?). It was supposed to be an epic party all about peace, love, celebrating life and sharing a wonderful experience together. As the dance party turned to a nightmare, with 364 people killed, and 44 taken hostage into Gaza, thousands of people fled through the surrounding fields to escape this modern-day pogrom that saw the most Jews killed in any one day since the Holocaust. Standing in that space, at the powerful memorial that has been put up to commemorate these beautiful souls, we gathered at the end of our experience to offer prayers and say the Mourner's Kaddish. My colleague and friend, Rabbi Michael Schwab, explained that in this moment, many of us were likely feeling a whole lot of emotions at once — anger, sadness, fear, and pride at the Israeli spirit and resilience we were seeing all around us. Holding all of these emotions at once was simply the reality of the space that we were in, literally and figuratively.

As I stared at the fields surrounding the Nova Festival, as I thought of the many Jews (and others) who had run, fleeing for their lives through those forests, I thought of my daughter who had just been to Poland a week before as a part of her semester abroad program in Israel. She too had just been in a forest, "The Children's Forest," where 800 children were shot and murdered in cold blood simply for being Jews during the Holocaust. In that moment, near those forests at the Nova site, I was overwhelmed by the magnitude of history collapsing upon itself. And I recognized that two things are true at once. First, throughout our entire experience as Jews, we have faced hatred and persecution. And also, throughout our entire experience we have shown an incredible strength and resolve that is, in many ways, the secret to our continued existence. This year, even and especially now, we must lean into both of those emotions, acknowledging and recognizing our collective pain, while *refusing* to fall into despair as a people who are continually, and incredibly, resilient.

As one sign at the Nova Memorial site said, "We will dance again."

These are trying and difficult days. This Yom Hashoah the events of history feel all too close. This Yom Hazikaron, we grieve at the tremendous loss of the men and women of the IDF, soldiers, many of whom are all of 22-23 years old who I spoke to in Israel and who each had a harrowing and incredible story to tell. This Yom Ha'atzmaut we worry about the future of our relatively "new" Jewish State. We worry about this war. We worry about future prospects of peace, about the hostages, about what will happen in the region more broadly; we worry about the Jewish character of a State that belongs to all of us as a Jewish people. And, yet we marvel

at the strength and resilience of the State of Israel, a homeland that we should celebrate even as we are in pain.

We as a people, have been in dark places before. And we as a people, have always found a way to move forward toward a brighter future. May we hold onto hope that better days are around the corner, even as we mourn the losses of our people – past and present – during these intense three days of mourning and celebration. Indeed, as the sign at Nova said, we will dance again. Am Yisrael Chai.

Rescued from the Shoah and now 250 years old, a Czech Torah sat before her. She gets mixed up with the wrong crowd and when she really gets into trouble, her parents decide to return to their roots in the Orthodox Syrian Jewish community in Brooklyn. Casey's world is turned upside down as she tries to adjust to new experiences and new friends. She is at first shocked by the unfamiliar culture, but ends up marrying at eighteen, believing she can adjust to the Syrian culture and her husband's ways. Ultimately, she is not sure she can integrate the world she grew up in and the world she married into.


