CHOOSING JUDAISM



Life is about choices. Coffee or Tea? Chocolate or Vanilla? City or Suburbs? Work or taking some time off? Exercise or watching TV/endless scrolling? Actual vacation or "work" vacation?

The upcoming Festival of Shavuot, which begins on Wednesday, June 12th, is also all about choices. One of three pilgrimage festivals, in biblical times, Shavuot commemorated the start of the wheat harvest in the land of Israel and the bringing of the "first fruits" to the Temple. By the rabbinic period, Shavuot also came to be

understood as the holiday during which we celebrate the giving and receiving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. On Shavuot we celebrate the idea that God chose to enter into a relationship with the Jewish people that was to be rooted in Torah. While this notion has led, historically, to an understanding that Jews are "the chosen people," I have always understood "chosen" to mean something more like "special," rather than "superior." For me, to be "chosen," simply means to have a unique and special relationship with God that is expressed through the lens of Torah. But like any relationship, this covenant is meaningless unless we, as individuals, choose to be "chosen." I once heard it said that we should really call ourselves "the choosing people" and not "the chosen people."

Actively choosing our Judaism is something that we are to consider on this upcoming Festival of Shavuot when we read the book of Ruth, the first person to convert and join the people of Israel. It was Ruth who famously said to her mother-in-law Naomi, when there was nothing left keeping her connected to her Israelite family, "Wherever you go, I will go. Your people will be my people and your God will be my God."

Whenever I work with conversion candidates (and sometimes their partners), I am always so impressed and inspired. They are always so eager to learn, and the spark of their Jewish souls tends to shine very brightly. The convert to Judaism tends to look at our heritage as a gift to be explored, treasured, protected, and lived each and every day. She often finds a deep sense of comfort, history, and connection in the celebration of our rituals, holidays, and the Hebrew of our prayers. He understands that every choice he makes, from the most profound to the most simple, has the potential to be infused with our Jewish teachings and traditions. She understands the message of Shavuot: that Torah, Jewish practices, values, and beliefs can only be meaningful and relevant to a person if they actively "choose" to bring them into their lives.

This is a lesson that all of us could stand to remember, even, and especially this year as so many feel a strong pull back towards the tribe that is the Jewish people. Perhaps a silver lining during these immensely challenging times post-October 7th is that people might consider just what it means to cast their lot with the Jewish people. What does it mean to you? What parts of Judaism do you choose? What parts have you ignored? What choices have you made in the past, or will you make in the present, to ensure that your connection to Judaism is deep, and not simply activated in response to a threat, or feelings of insecurity?

CHOOSING JUDAISM



Choosing Judaism is not always so easy. Choices, by their very nature, involve sacrifice. The family choices that we make, the financial choices that we make, and the professional choices that we make, can all be extremely difficult. The Jewish choices that we make are no exception. Choosing to pray, to celebrate Shabbat, to observe Kashrut, to be honest in our business dealings, to reach out to those less fortunate than us, to make time to study and learn the ways of our tradition, or to engage our kids in formal and informal education, is not always an easy choice. Choosing to stand up for Israel, to educate ourselves about Israel, to stand proudly

as a Jew in public, is not always an easy choice. **But the easy choice is not always the wisest choice and it is certainly not necessarily the most valuable choice.** Shavuot reminds us that the most meaningful and rewarding choices in life are often the hardest to make. Since the moment of revelation at Mount Sinai, we have understood that choices require a brit, a covenant, a commitment. Meaningful choices take work. The choice to get married, for example, may seem easy at first, but a healthy approach to marriage understands that a lot of work is involved. The choice to have a child may seem simple, but the realities of having children are often anything but that. And yet most people would likely say that their marriage and their children are the most precious things in their lives.

With Shavuot around the corner and summer fast approaching, let us consider how we might choose to deepen our Jewish connection in the coming year. Will we come to the synagogue more often? Light Shabbat candles, or sit down to dinner with our family on Friday night? Find some meaningful Jewish material to read, study, or listen to as we sit on the beach? Go to Israel to volunteer? How might we strive to become more involved – socially, religiously, financially, and educationally in our community?

There are consequences to every single Jewish choice that we make, and to every single Jewish choice we fail to make. As we say each time that we put the Torah back into the ark, the Torah can only be a *tree of life* to those who are willing *to grasp hold of it.* May each of us choose to take hold of this precious gift that will keep us grounded and rooted throughout our lives.

Dr. Granet graduated from Downstate Medical Center after which he completed his post graduate medical training at North Shore University Hospital (now Northwell) and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, NY, before moving with his family to NJ in 1993, where he was a board certified Internist in private practice. Dr. Granet has held numerous positions at Monmouth Medical Center including **Ethics Chair, Chairman of the Department of Medicine** (where he led Monmouth Medical Center through the Covid 19 Pandemic), before transitioning to his current position as **Chief Medical Officer** in 2021, during which tenure he was an author of recognized, published, groundbreaking research on Covid 19.

Dr. Granet has received numerous teaching awards and has been recognized by his peers consistently as a "Top Doctor" in New Jersey as well as nationally. Recent honorees include Dr. Anthony Fauci, Cardinal Dolan and NJ Governor Phil Murphy.


