#### PRESENCE AS A SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE



We often have a debate in our family about whether or not multi-tasking is something that people can actually do effectively. Admittedly, I am not very good at focusing on more than one thing at a time. If I am doing work on the computer, I can't be watching TV at the same time. If you are trying to talk to me, and I am on my phone, I am not really paying attention to you. I may register what you are saying to me, but I am not really taking it in. If I am cooking dinner and someone needs help with homework or anything else, either something gets burned, or someone doesn't get helped! "What do you mean?" you may be thinking. "I can do more than one thing at once, and I can do them both well! I have even changed clothes, or put on makeup in the car while driving!"

Well, it turns out that while many of us may think that we are excellent multi-taskers, there is at least *some* scientific data that does not support our belief. Neurologist Earl Miller, a professor at MIT who has studied and written about this issue over the past number of years, explains:

"People can't multitask very well, and when people say they can, they're deluding themselves. The brain is very good at deluding itself. What we can do, he said, is shift our focus from one thing to the next with astonishing speed. Switching from task to task, you think you're actually paying attention to everything around you at the same time. But you're actually not. You're not paying attention to one or two things simultaneously, but switching between them very rapidly... For early humans, that sort of miscalculation could have meant becoming a tiger's lunch. These days, the consequences are more likely to be stress, a blunder, or maybe a car crash." (Hamilton, Think You're Multitasking? Think Again)

And what does all of this have to do with our Jewish lives? It turns out, quite a bit because there are spiritual pitfalls that come along with trying to multi-task as well. Last month we celebrated the Festival of Shavuot, commemorating the revelation of the Torah on Mount Sinai. The Torah tells us that when God asked Moses to come up the mountain, God said:

Come up to Me on the mountain **and be there (v'heyeh)**, and I will give you the stone tablets with the teachings and commandments which I have inscribed to instruct them." **Exodus** 24:12

Why the redundancy here? Why the seemingly unnecessary phrase "and be there," when Moses was already told to "come up" on the mountain? Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Kotzk explains that this seemingly superfluous phrase is necessary because it is proof that:

a person can exert tremendous effort to reach the top of a mountain, yet without being there. He may be standing on the mountain, but his head may be elsewhere. The main thing is not the ascent, but being there, and only there, and not to be below at the same time. **Rabbi Menahem Mendel of Kotzk, 1787-1859** 

In other words, God was reminding Moses that it was not enough to climb up the mountain to receive the Torah; God wanted Moses to be present in that moment. God was reminding Moses not to be distracted by the people waiting for him, by their concerns, or by anything that he forgot at the bottom of the mountain!

If distraction during revelation was a concern for Moses, how much more is this a challenge for each of us in our daily lives and our daily interactions? We are distracted by so much these days – our anxieties, the constant barrage of messages on our phones, the news, the fast pace that is life in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, etc.

During this summer season, as we enjoy the pleasures of living along the beautiful Jersey shore, I want to invite us to remember the importance of being present in the moment. Can we take a few moments to sit quietly and simply notice our surroundings, intentionally, slowly, each day? Whether we are on the beach, spending time with family on vacation, at work, or at home, can we challenge ourselves to strive to multi-task less, and focus a bit more? Can we strive to quiet our minds a bit this summer from the distractions, stresses, and anxieties that are taking up too much space in our lives?

May each of us learn to rise to the challenge that God gave to Moses – working to create the frame of mind, practice, and sense of inner peace needed to remain present throughout our daily interactions, as we strive to notice the sacred gift of life that is all around us.







Meet Seth Bornstein, author of Swimming to Jerusalem



Swimming to Jerusalem is the story of Bram Goodman, his family, friends, colleagues, and demons.

Born in France, he spent his childhood in Israel and moved to the United States as a teenager. After his freshman college year, he went back to Israel and enlisted in the Army with his cousin Yoni. After his discharge, an aimless and disillusioned Bram made his way to Paris where he met Liz, an American, and followed her back to the States. Decades later, when Theo, his youngest child, was seeking to learn about his heritage, Bram began to confront the past that he had attempted to keep at bay. It is a journey that took him back, both emotionally and physically, to a place he thought he could leave behind.


