### ONE YEAR LATER: ENTERING A SEASON OF SIMCHA (JOY) AND SUFFERING



As we enter into the month of October, we do so filled with mixed emotions. The *Yamim Noraim*, Days of Awe, are upon us, leading into the Festival of Sukkot, followed by Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah. Throughout this month of Tishrei in the Jewish calendar, the Jewish people traditionally move from a period of seriousness and reflection to a period of heightened gratitude and joy for the gift of life.

But the line is not so straight this year. This October, and this Tishrei feel different as we mark the first anniversary of October 7<sup>th</sup>. This year, as we recall that morning of Shemini Atzeret, one year ago, where joy turned into horrific tragedy, we may be at a loss for just how to respond. Sukkot, for instance, may be considered *zmann simchateynu*, the season of our rejoicing, but how can we rejoice on this one-year anniversary of the largest pogrom

to face the Jewish people in recent memory?

As I consider this question, I am reminded of an important text from the Talmud (Baba Batra 60b), where the sages are trying to figure out how to move forward with their lives, as they try to rebuild their lives and Jewish society in the shadow of the destruction of the Temple. Remember that this *churban*, this destruction, was earth shattering to our sages. The singular Temple, that was at the center of the ancient Israelite practice and world view, had been destroyed. How will we manage? How will we move forward with life, our sages wondered.

The Sages said: A person may plaster his house with plaster, but he must leave over a small amount in it without plaster to remember the destruction of the Temple... a person may prepare all that he needs for a meal, but he must leave out a small item to remember the destruction of the Temple... a woman may engage in all of her cosmetic treatments, but she must leave out a small matter to remember the destruction of the Temple...

At a wedding, Rav Yithak taught, **burnt ashes** are customarily placed **on the head** [*rosh*] **of bridegrooms**... to remember the destruction of the Temple.

What was their answer? Our sages reminded us that when national tragedy strikes, we must take time to actively remember it, and keep it with us (in some form or another), even during our most heightened periods of joy. While there is such a thing as "excessive mourning" (something that the Talmud discusses just above this text), we are simultaneously being reminded that to "ignore" our grieving and our pain is simply not an option.

This October there will be plenty of moments for this kind of remembering. We are hosting local synagogues in our sanctuary on October 7<sup>th</sup>, to remember the horrific events of one year ago and grieve for the year that we have all experienced together as a people this year. Please register on the temple website to attend. It will be important for us to be together.

In addition, perhaps our celebration of Sukkot this year will be different. Perhaps we might consider hanging pictures of the hostages, or pictures from this last year in Israel on one wall of our Sukkah. Perhaps, in addition to the traditional welcoming of our spiritual ancestors (the Ushpizin), we will also take time to symbolically welcome in the memories of those who have been lost in this year of war, and of those whose lives were cut short by the attack of October 7<sup>th</sup>. Perhaps on Simchat Torah we will do a silent *hakafah*, circuit, with the Torah. No singing. No dancing. Just a moment of reflection and remembrance. But regardless of whether you are here with us for our community recollections and remembrances in our "season of rejoicing," or you are unable to join us, I invite you to consider ways that you might commemorate this one-year anniversary, even and especially as we begin this gift of a new year together.

As the text from the Talmud above concludes:

...anyone who mourns for the destruction of Jerusalem will merit and see its joy, as it is stated: "Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad with her, all that love her; rejoice for joy with her, all that mourn for her" (Isaiah 66:10).

So may it be for us, as we mourn for the victims of October 7<sup>th</sup> this year. As we remember the hostages, the horrible anti-Semitism that we witnessed throughout our country on college campuses and beyond, and the tragedies of this last year for our people, may our tears be mixed with our pride as we feel gratitude that we are a part of this incredible people and nation of Israel who have been blessed with the gift of a new year.

May this year be better than the last, and may we never lose hope that a better and brighter future, a future of peace, is indeed possible.

Men's Club will supply breakfast for all who help. Bring some work gloves and a positive attitude. You will be performing a mitzvah.


