ON VOTING & THE DAY AFTER



When I was growing up, our local voting station was in the garage of the house next door. I have fond memories of walking with my mother to Mrs. Sweeny's house each time there was an election. I especially liked getting a sticker to show everyone that my family had voted that day! I must admit that as the years went on, I was not always so "good" about remembering to vote. But eventually, I realized the error of my ways and recognized that as both Jews and Americans, we have the responsibility and the privilege to take this opportunity seriously. That is why each of us must make the time to vote in the November 5th election.

While we might not normally think of voting as a Jewish issue, concern and involvement with our government is long-standing Jewish value. The Mishnah in Pirkei Avot, 3:3 teaches us to: *Pray for the welfare of the government, for were it not for fear of it, people would swallow each other alive.* We are to pray for a government, in other words, that will help keep us from harming one another and encourage us to rise together in pursuit of the common good.

How each of us votes is an extremely personal matter, but as with all things in life, we should strive to incorporate our Jewish values into this decision. Clearly Israel is in the forefront of all of our minds this year, as it should be. And, it is also true that Judaism speaks to numerous other issues in our lives and society as well. From healthcare to the economy, to questions of reproductive rights, the environment, education, how we care for the poor and needy (just to name a few), we are to ask ourselves what Judaism has to say about these issues, and vote with our values. It is true, that sometimes these Jewish values and perspectives do not fit clearly in one political box, but we have an obligation to consider what our tradition has to say on a variety of issues and then make our decisions with that in mind. Sometimes, that can make our choices complicated; other times, it can make the choice clear in our minds.

But regardless of how we vote in this coming election, first and foremost we must remember that we, as members of the same Jewish community, are not "enemies." We are not "playing on opposite teams." We are an extended family of sorts, a *kehillah kedosha* (a sacred community), a group of people made in God's image who have a responsibility to one another, and to the broader community of which we are blessed to be a part. There are plenty of people out there today who are seeking to divide us, to create infighting among the Jewish people; plenty of people who profit off of creating division rather than promoting unity. We, as Jews, must fight against that division. We, as Jews, know where division leads, where *sinat chinam*, senseless hatred, leads – to destruction. That is why our sages taught that the Second temple was destroyed because of senseless hatred, because of factionalism between Jews. We know better. And we must always strive to remember that, as our sages say elsewhere, *kol Yisrael areivim ze ba ze*, all of Israel is responsible for one another (literally, mixed up together).

We are all connected and we must work to remain so after November 5th. If, and when, we disagree with our family members, neighbors, co-workers or fellow congregants following this election, let us remember to speak to one another with thoughtfulness, kindness, an attentive ear and an open heart. Let us remember that we are descents of Hillel and Shammai, known famously for their ability to debate, respect one another, and agree to disagree. May we take that mandate seriously as we move into these uncertain times, divided as ever. May we, as Jews, be a model for how Americans might learn to come together once this election season is behind us.

As we conclude this High Holiday season, on the eve of an extremely consequential election in our country, let us remember that many of our grandparents and great grandparents could not have dreamed of the opportunity to participate in setting the direction of the society in which they lived. We are each blessed with the ability to participate in our democracy. May we take this honor seriously, as we embrace the blessing and privilege that is our ability and opportunity to vote. And when it is over, may we never forget that we are, first and foremost, a community of kind, caring, and good people who aim to leave the world just a little better than we found it; *m'dor l'dor*, from generation to generation. *Ken Yehi Ratson*, so may it be God's will, and so may it be ours.







Meet Maya Arad, author of *The Hebrew Teacher*



Three Israeli women, their lives altered by immigration to the United States, seek to overcome crises. Ilana is a veteran Hebrew instructor at a Midwestern college who has built her life around her career. Miriam, whose son left Israel to make his fortune in Silicon Valley, pays an unwanted visit to meet her new grandson and discovers cracks in the family's perfect façade. Efrat, another Israeli in California, is determined to help her daughter navigate the challenges of middle school.

In these three stirring novellas which make up *The Hebrew Teacher*, celebrated Israeli author, Maya Arad probes the demise of idealism and the generation gap her heroines must confront.

Maya Arad is the author of eleven books of Hebrew fiction as well as studies in literary criticism and linguistics. Born in Israel in 1971, she received a PhD in linguistics from University College, London and for the past twenty years has lived in California where she is currently writer in residence at Stanford University's Taube Center for Jewish Studies.
