


Pasta Dinner:

HONORING OUR ELDERS WITH GRACE AND COMPASSION



There is a story told of a frail old man who went to live with his son and daughter in-law as it became increasingly difficult for him to take care of himself. Every night, the family would sit down to dinner together – the grandfather, his children, and their four-year-old son. And every night, the grandfather's shaking hands and failing eyesight would make eating rather difficult. Food would fall off of his plate; his drink would often spill on the table cloth; silverware would fall to the floor and over the course of a week, the grandfather would usually break something.

One night the old man's son, irritated with the mess, declared to his wife that he had had enough of this mess. The next day, he set aside a separate table in the corner complete with a wooden bowl and wooden utensils so that the grandfather would no longer break

anything. That night at dinner, the four-year-old boy looked curiously at his grandfather, who had tears in his eyes as he ate in silence. His parents, in the meantime, continued to chastise the old man whenever he dropped something on the floor, though they were relieved that nothing else had broken.

This went on for a few days until one evening, the parents noticed that the boy sat down on the floor with a huge pile of sticks and wooden scraps that he had collected.

"What are you doing with those wooden sticks," his father and mother gently inquired.

"Oh," the boy said sweetly, "I am making a bowl for you and mommy to eat your food from when I am a grown up." The four-year-old smiled and went back to work. The parents were speechless. That night, the husband took the grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the family table. From that moment on, there was no longer any yelling at dinner. The grandfather ate in peace, supported and cared for by his loving children who learned to be more patient, caring, and understanding thanks to the wisdom of their young son (Schram, Jewish Stories One Generation Tells Another).

One of the privileges of serving as a congregational rabbi is that I get an up-close look at how a community deals with aging. Adult children taking care of parents, grandparents taking care of children, people living a much longer life expectancy well into their 80s, 90s and even beyond. There are tremendous blessings that come with the wisdom gained from length of years. That is why our tradition equates someone who is old (*zaken*), with someone who has acquired wisdom (*zeh*, *kaneh chochmah*). But there are also tremendous challenges that come with aging. Loss of independence, physical, emotional, and cognitive challenges, shifts in family dynamics, and the many, many, practical considerations that accompany the challenges of dealing with life – whether you are elderly, or caring for someone who is elderly.

Judaism has much wisdom and guidance when it comes to this area of life. The Torah tells us that we are to *rise before the aged and show deference to the old* (Lev. 19:32). Indeed this very verse is found on most busses in Israel, reminding passengers to give up their seats for their elders. We are taught in the Talmud to respect our elders when they begin to forget things, as that which is "broken" is still sacred. That is why the broken tablets of the first set of commandments were said to be placed in the ark of the Covenant alongside the second set (Babylonian Talmud, Berakhot 8b). We are taught in our sources that the mitzvah of honoring our parents, as they age,

...obligates us to ensure that our parents have adequate shelter, food, clothing, and transportation. It is our responsibility to see that they are well cared for. There is a debate in the sources about financial responsibility. Some authorities hold that a child must pay for a parent's needs, while others argue that the child is obliged to make sure the needs are met, but can use the parent's money to pay for this (Friedman, <u>Jewish Visions For Aging</u>, 88).

But, unfortunately, none of this is easy. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel articulated this succinctly back in 1961, at the first White House Conference on Aging, when he said that: *A test of a people is how it behaves toward the old. It is easy to love children. Even tyrants and dictators make a point of being fond of children. But the affection and care for the old, the incurable, the helpless are the true gold mines of a culture (To Grow In Wisdom, Heschel, The Insecurity of Freedom, 72).*

I share all of this to remind all of you that your synagogue family is here to help support you through this process. While we are not a social service organization, and there are limits to some of the practical ways that we can help — we are available to be an emotional support and offer Jewish guidance and wisdom when applicable. We are available as a *beit knesset*, a place of gathering, where children taking care of parents, parents and grandparents navigating the changes that accompany length of years, and their caretakers, can come together to lend emotional and spiritual support to one another. The one thing that I have observed is that none of this is easy. But much of it is a privilege, and sometimes, even a blessing. Please remember that if this issue is one with which you struggle, you are not alone. I am here, your synagogue family is here, and together we can try to support one another in ways that are both meaningful, and holy.


