ON MAKING MORNING MINYAN



When I was in high school, I was very involved in synagogue life. I was the religious/education vice president for our USY chapter, I sat on the ritual committee, I would regularly attend Shabbat services, and of course, I would even try to make Sunday morning minyan in case they needed a tenth (plus, I got breakfast after minyan)! Fast forward to college, where I was involved and eventually put in charge of our Conservative minyan at the Hillel. We were always looking for that “tenth,” so that we could conduct a complete Shabbat or holiday service, and, if any student needed to say Kaddish, they could do so. (Again, food helped! Deli for Shabbat lunch as I recall.) In rabbinical school, I was a regular minyan attendee. I even had a regular seat, right behind our beloved Dean, Rabbi Lebeau, and I rarely missed a morning. As I think back to each of these periods in my life – high school, college, rabbinical school – the one constant is daily minyan. For nearly 30 years, daily minyan has been a part of my morning routine.

When I first became a rabbi at a synagogue in Silicon Valley, the community did not have a daily minyan. But then, our beloved Senior Rabbi’s wife died, and I (with a bit of chutzpah perhaps), pushed our community to ensure that there was a minyan for their beloved rabbi of over 25 years to say Kaddish. And thus, a daily evening minyan was born. Imagine my delight when I came to our wonderful Congregation Torat El community to discover that we have a minyan twice a day! I remember feeling that it was so wonderful, and so rare, for a Conservative synagogue to have a regular minyan. I was proud of that fact, and remain proud until this day.

As I have said for many years, caring for and sustaining our minyan is something that is our collective responsibility. As author Patti Moskowitz teaches in her book about minyan: *“One rabbi cannot make a minyan, but ten shoemakers can.”* We have, over the years, been blessed at CTE to have many shoemakers in our midst. We have been blessed to have a small but dedicated core who have come regularly, rain, snow, or shine, to help ensure that we have a space to hold a complete prayer service in the morning, and for loved ones who wish to remember someone who has died, to be able to come and say the mourner’s Kaddish.

We have been blessed – but recently, we have also been struggling.

For the past couple of years, getting an “in person” daily minyan in the morning has been a real challenge. Many of our dedicated volunteers, due to issues of aging and mobility, are simply not able to get here as regularly anymore. And frankly, it is not fair to expect a handful of our 80- and 90-year-olds to ensure that our entire community has a daily minyan. Thanks to the initiative of our wonderful Ben Laskowitz, in addition to sending out letters to members, we have begun emailing those of you who have a *yahrzeit* coming up and asking if they would like a minyan. That has often proved to be helpful in ensuring that we get 10 people on those mornings. We have a wonderful “Whatsapp” group that has also been very helpful when we need “one or two” more. If you are interested in joining, we would love to add you! Over the years we have reached out in many ways to help ensure that we had a daily, in person, morning minyan, but for a variety of reasons, including the very real challenge that many people work at that hour of the morning, it has proven to be a challenge as of late. Interestingly, since our Covid-era switch of evening minyan to zoom, we have rarely missed an evening. I remain so thankful to all of our dedicated lay leaders who make this happen day in and day out. This has allowed people near and far to come on to pray with us each night, and often observe a *yahrzeit* or say Kaddish for a loved one. So, where do we, as a community that has historically been committed to a daily minyan, go from here?

ON MAKING MORNING MINYAN CONT...

In an effort to ensure that we have a morning minyan on a more regular basis, we have made the decision that **we are going to be moving daily minyan, on non-Torah reading days, to zoom. We will remain in person on Mondays, Thursdays, and other Torah reading days (Rosh Hodesh, Hanukkah, Hol Hamoed Sukkot and Pesach). And of course, this will not change any of our Shabbat service times. Evening zoom will remain the same.** We are hopeful that this adjustment will make it easier for more people to join us on a more regular basis. While we are aware that this experience is different from "in person," and in some senses less fulfilling, we are also hopeful that this will help us ensure that daily morning prayer remains an essential part of our synagogue's spiritual practice for many years to come. And, as I have said many times in the life of our congregation, this is where we are as a community "right now." It is possible that we will build back towards an in person daily minyan in the future. But currently, we believe that this is what the moment requires.

Most importantly, as always, I want to invite you to help us "make the minyan" (as the expression goes). Maybe from your desk at work, or from your breakfast table at home, for 30 minutes in the morning. As long as we can see and hear you, you count! And if you have 45 minutes to spare on Monday or Thursday to hear the weekly Torah reading, we would love to see you! Let's face it: it is not often that we manage to carve out time in our busy schedules to join together with members of our community to deepen our spiritual practice, connect with our community members, or make time to remember a loved one. Morning minyan – on zoom and in person – gives us this opportunity. We hope that you will join us!

Same minyan time, slightly different mechanism, same zoom channel!

Monday & Thursday (8:00AM in person); Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday (8:00AM on Zoom); Sunday (8:30AM on Zoom). We look forward to praying with you.
