## New Year, New Opportunities & A New Focus



Years ago, a young couple sat in my office in preparation for their upcoming wedding. In addition to meeting with me, the couple had the foresight to do some pre-marital counselling with a therapist as they journeyed towards this significant transition in their life. In the course of our conversations about their Jewish lives in general, and married life in particular, they shared with me a small piece of advice that the therapist had offered them when it came to the stress of that particular moment in time. The therapist told them that *there are essentially two columns of things that we encounter on a day-to-day basis – the things that we can control and* 

the things that we can't control. Most of our anxiety and stress stems from trying to control the things that are in the "can't control" column. It was a simple observation, but an important one that I come back to on a regular basis and find myself considering as we prepare for the New Year that is almost upon us.

Many of us, particularly these days, seem to be carrying a tremendous amount of stress – stress about America, about Israel, about the world; stress about our financial, physical, or emotional well-being; stress about our children and grandchildren, and on and on. We are sometimes the embodiment of the old Jewish joke about how Jews used to send one another a telegram when sharing bad news. The telegram said simply: "Start worrying. Details to follow." Some of us, more than others, tend to be the embodiment of that old Yiddish term, drei cups, people who literally "spin our heads" about all sorts of things. Along comes Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur with a stark reminder, a huge stop sign of sorts in our lives that says: "Wait. Stop. Let me remind you of something. You will die eventually. But you are alive today. You have 'returned' to another year. What are you doing with the gift of time that you have been granted?" It's kind of like a bucket of cold water being thrown into our faces urging us to stop spinning, and to stand still for a moment in order to take stock and re-group.

How much of what we are worrying about is "in our control," and how much is "out of our control?" During this time of year that we are invited to engage in some *cheshbon ha-nefesh*, soul searching, we are invited to consider those areas in our life that we might somehow be able to "change." Is there an apology that needs to be made? Are there priorities that need to be re-aligned? Are there habits that we can try to "manage" in a healthier way even if they are challenging? What are the top three things that we would like to change this year about ourselves, about our relationships, about the way that we behave in the world? And, most importantly, how many of these things are in the "can control" column?

The direction for this type of spiritual growth each year was once expressed quite beautifully by the Hassidic Rabbi Yechiel Michel of Zlotchov, who taught that:

There are two things it is forbidden to worry about. That which is possible to fix and that which is impossible to fix. What is possible to fix, fix it and why worry? That which is impossible to fix, how will worrying help?

This is easier said than done, but as we approach Rosh Hashanah, let us each take a deep breath and remember that we have been given a gift – the gift of a new beginning. What do we want to change? What can we change? And where, or how, might we begin? All it takes is one step in a new direction.

As we begin this New Year together, let us consider this short prayer by Rabbi Naomi Levy:

When we worry, God, teach us to breathe. When we are anxious, God, remind us to notice. When we are spinning God, help us to slow down.

May we enter into the gift of this New Year, aware that there is so much that is unknown, while striving to quiet our anxiety and become the best possible version of ourselves.

L'Shanah Tovah U'metukah – may it be a good and sweet New Year for all of us.


## **Sisterhood Book Club**




This program gives temple members the opportunity to participate in a formal service at the traditional time of visiting loved ones who have left our physical world.





# Sunday, October 26, 11:00am Meet Mary Morris, author of *The Red House*



Mary Morris's *The Red House,* weaves together the intimate story of a daughter searching for answers about her vanished mother with the largely untold story of Italian Jews during World War II.

Thirty years ago, Laura's mother, Viola, went missing. She left behind her purse, her keys and her mysterious paintings of a red house. Viola was never found, and her family never recovered. Laura, an artist herself, held on to the paintings. On the back of each work, her mother scrawled in Italian, "I will not be here forever." The family never understood what Viola meant.

Decades later, at a crossroads in her marriage and her life, Laura returns to Italy, where her parents met after World War II and where Laura spent the earliest years of her childhood.

Laura follows her mother's trajectory as she ventures north to Naples, Turin and finally home. Along the way, she confronts the dark truth of her mother's story and at last makes sense of her own.

One review of the book states: "Morris has created a novel that honors both the specific experiences of Italian Jews during WWII and the universal experiences of love, loss and the search for identity."

Mary Morris is the author of numerous works of fiction, including the novels *Gateway to the Moon, The Jazz Palace, A Mother's Love,* and *House Arrest;* and of nonfiction, including the travel classic *Nothing to Declare: Memoirs of a Woman Traveling Alone.* Morris is a recipient of the Rome Prize in Literature and the 2016 Anisfield-Wolf Book Award for Fiction. She lives in Brooklyn, NY.




