Dr. Benji Davis is an American-born Israeli scholar and educator, currently serving as Assistant Professor of Jewish Education at Yeshiva University's Azrieli Graduate School of Jewish Education and Administration. The founding director of IMPACT Israel Education, he most recently served as head of Israel education at Camp Yavneh and as the 2024-2025 Israel Institute Teaching and Research Fellow at George Mason University. In 2024, he received the Harold Wechsler Award for Emerging Scholars from the Network for Research in Jewish Education (NRJE) for his research on teaching about Israel. While Benji calls Jerusalem home, he currently lives in the DC area with his wife Rachel and their three daughters Maia, Ella, and Lia.

WHAT TORAH HAVE YOU LEARNED LATELY?



Many years ago, during my orientation to rabbinical school, the dean of the school at the time, Rabbi William Lebeau, encouraged all of us to make the most of our years as students. *Don't be in too much of a rush to 'get out into the field,'* he would remind us. *You will have your lifetime to serve the Jewish people, but you will find as the years go on, that you have much less time to study, to simply sit with your friends and learn.* Nearly 30 years later, I have come to truly understand what he meant by those sage words of advice. Time is precious, and time spent learning 'lishma,' for its own sake (not for a class or a sermon, etc.) is indeed something that is rare, precious, and a blessing that I have re-discovered in recent years thanks to my *daf yomi* practice, leading me to explore one folio page of Talmud a day (no matter what else is happening).

Shammai taught that we are to '*aseh toratekha keva,*' make our [study of the] Torah a fixed practice; (speak little, but do much; and receive all men with a pleasant face [Avot 1:15]). That is one of the reasons that I encouraged all of us on Rosh Hashanah, to face the challenges of the moment as a Jewish people, by leaning into our Judaism. Specifically, in addition to "doing Jewish," I encouraged all of us to take our mandate as Jewish learners seriously. With the weather starting to cool down, our time on the beach coming to a close, and the holidays now firmly behind us, I wonder how everyone is doing with that challenge. What are you curious about when it comes to holes in your Jewish education (history, Hebrew, prayer, theology, basics of holidays, Israel, business ethics, medical ethics, character development, Talmud, Midrash, Bible, mysticism and Jewish spirituality, etc.)? And what can you do to start learning, not eventually, but today? It goes without saying that you can always email me for advice (rabbi@torat-el.org), or call the office and we can make a time to talk (732-531-4410) about things you are interested in learning about. But, in the meantime, I thought I would share a few resources with you that might help you get started.
