REMEMBERING THAT WE WERE STRANGERS IN EGYPT



About a month from now, we will gather around our Passover tables, preparing to celebrate one of our most important holidays. Marking the beginnings of our people and our perilous biblical journey from slavery to freedom, our master story of the Exodus should remind each of us, particularly this year, that we are all descendants of immigrants. This is true for us as a people, and for each of us as individuals who, more likely than not, have someone in our family history who immigrated to America from somewhere else. Indeed I would imagine that many of us have family stories about members who understood what it meant to be a “stranger” fleeing persecution, and seeking redemption and safe haven in a land of

freedom.

The Torah tells us, 36 times, to remember the stranger because “we were strangers in Egypt” and God redeemed us, bringing us into the Promised Land. Welcoming the stranger is one of the most repeated mitzvot in the entire Torah. As we gather around the table with family and friends we are invited to remember that the Exodus tells the story of a persecuted people escaping to freedom. And we are called to understand that because we have known what it means to be oppressed, we have a responsibility towards others who are oppressed, and living among us, today. As the Torah teaches quite explicitly:

When a stranger resides with you in your land, you shall not wrong them. The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens; you shall love the stranger as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I the LORD am your God (Leviticus 19:33-34).

As these ancient words make clear, Jews have an obligation to care for those living among us who are strangers, often fleeing from oppression to seek a better life. We don’t have to go as far back as Egypt to remind ourselves of our history of persecution and seeking freedom from oppression. From Spain in the Middle Ages, to Europe during WWII, to North African and Muslim majority countries post 1948, to Jews not feeling safe in certain countries today, we have known persecution from the time of Pharaoh onward. That awareness, says our heritage, comes with certain obligations. We are not to oppress the stranger: You shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the feelings of the stranger, having yourselves been strangers in the land of Egypt (Exodus 23:9). Indeed we are taught to treat them with a measure of equality. You shall have one standard of judgment for migrant and citizen alike: for I the LORD am your God (Leviticus 24:22).

The details of our obligation can be debated, but the overall principle is extremely clear. We have to look no further in our seder ritual than the beginning to find the theme of caring for those in need. As we recite the “ha lachma anya,” we hold up a broken piece of matzah and declare: “This is the bread of affliction that our fathers ate in the land of Egypt. Let all who are hungry, come and eat; let all who are in need, come and join us for the Pesach.” Right out of the gate, so to speak, we are reminded that this gathering is not just about memory, it is also about responsibility. It is a call to action to care for the oppressed, the stranger, and those who are in need.

I know that immigration is a “hot button” issue today. But it is an ancient issue for us. That is why this year, at your Passover seders, I want to invite you to gently, thoughtfully, and seriously talk about this topic, about what it means to you personally, about what is happening in our country right now, and about what you think our obligation might be, as Jews, when it comes to helping those in need, specifically those fleeing persecution to look for a better life. There will, I hope, be nuance in your conversations. There will, I hope, be care and respect, and a desire to understand the facts of issues surrounding immigration in this country that can be found amidst the noise that surrounds us on all sides. There will, I hope, be an intentional avoidance of false-binary thinking; of remembering that our country can be both a place of law and morality, a place where we value both security and humanity. As you speak about this topic, I want to encourage each of you to share the stories of your own families, of how they arrived to this country, of where they came from and why they came to America.

REMEMBERING THAT WE WERE STRANGERS IN EGYPT



My prayer for us this Passover is that we take our ancient responsibility towards the stranger seriously. May we remember our shared humanity as we discuss this. May we remember that we are talking about real people with real families and real challenges who are often fleeing an oppression that many of us thankfully, have never experienced. May we remember, to paraphrase a teaching from the Mishnah (Avot 2:5), that in a place (or a society) where people are not standing up acting as decent human beings, we are to be those very people (and urge on our elected officials to be the same). May each of us consider all of this with love, care, and respect, for the story of our people that we hold so dear, and for the obligations and responsibilities which that story, in turn, passes down to us.





Meet David Denby, author of *Eminent Jews*



Leonard Bernstein, Mel Brooks, Betty Friedan, and Norman Mailer. Brilliant, brash, yet soulful, they were 100 percent Jewish and 100 percent American. They upended the restrained culture of their forebears and changed American life.

They worked in different fields, and apart from clinking glasses at parties now and then, they hardly knew one another. But they shared a historical moment and a common temperament. For all four, their Jewish heritage was electrified by American liberty. The results were explosive.

As prosperity for Jews increased and antisemitism began to fade after World War II, these four creative giants stormed through the latter half of the 20th century, altering the way people around the world listened to music, defined what was vulgar, comprehended the relations of men and women, and understood the American soul. They were not saints; they were turbulent and self-dissatisfied intellectuals who fearlessly wielded their own newly won freedom to charge up American culture.

Celebratory yet candid, at times fiercely critical, David Denby presents these four figures in *Eminent Jews* as egotistical and generous — larger-than-life all of them, yet vulnerable, even heartbreaking, in their ambition, ferocity, and pride.

David Denby is *The New York Times* bestselling author of *Great Books*. His other books include *American Sucker* and *Lit Up*. He was a film critic for *New York Magazine* and *The New Yorker*, where he is now a staff writer. His essays have appeared in *The New Republic* and *The Atlantic*. He lives in New York City with his wife, novelist Susan Rieger.
