THE GIFT OF “MAKING ARRANGEMENTS”



As many of you know, when I was 12, and my sisters had just turned 20 and 25, our mother died suddenly at the age of 50. Needless to say it was a terrible shock to the family, but one of the few things that made it more “manageable,” was the fact that my mother was a Type A+ organized planner. The plots had already been paid for years earlier. The funeral arrangements had been made. Everything was done. “All we had to do” was grieve. We didn’t have to figure out where she would have wanted to be buried. We didn’t have to deal with all of the paperwork, documents, etc. We didn’t have to think about what kind of a funeral she would want. It was done, and that, I came to discover later in life, was a tremendous gift.

Dealing with issues of death and dying are uncomfortable for many people. So many of us walk through life behaving, and perhaps thinking, that if we talk about death out loud, we might die. But if we engage in the very Jewish superstitious act of spitting three times, or saying “*kinehora*” (which is a Yiddish slang phrase meaning that we say “no to the evil eye”), we should recognize that this type of magical thinking is just that – not real. The sad truth is that everyone dies; it is the one thing, in addition to being born, that we all have in common. And there is nothing that we can do about it, except be as prepared as we can be – both for ourselves and for our families or friends who will be left behind to grieve.

There is a story told in the Talmud about two scribes who were standing in front of King Solomon when suddenly Solomon had a vision of the Angel of Death. The King said to the Angel of Death, “Why do you look so sad?” The Angel replied, “Because I am supposed to take these two scribes with me, and I am not sure how I am going to do that here.” Solomon, fearing for their lives, immediately sent them away to the district of Luz, a magical place where the Angel of Death had no dominion. When they arrived at the gates of Luz, they died. The next day, King Solomon saw that the Angel of Death was happy and couldn’t understand what had happened. He replied, “In the place that they asked me to take them, there you sent them.” In other words, the Angel of Death had been told to take these two scribes at the gates of Luz, and that’s exactly where they ended up.” Solomon replied, “The feet of a person are responsible for him; to the place where he is in demand, there they lead him.” (Babylonian Talmud, Sukkah 53a)

In other words, when our time is up, our time is up, and there is not too much that we can do about it. There are different versions of this story in traditions around the world, and whether or not you believe in fate, the message is that we cannot outrun death.

I share all of this with you to ask something of you. If you have not yet made plans for your funeral, including purchasing a plot (or as my aunt, who also died too young used to say, “her future real estate”), meeting with a funeral home, and sharing your thoughts about the type of funeral that you would like to have with those who will be handling the arrangements, please don’t wait. I cannot tell you how much added stress is caused whenever I speak with a family who has not yet made arrangements, and has to do so while they are completely distressed and emotionally depleted after a loved one has died. This has happened to me, on more than one occasion, when a family has (unfortunately) had ample time with a loved one who has been critically ill for years, but simply couldn’t bring themselves to make those calls. I promise you, talking about it out loud, meeting with me, or going to a funeral home will not make you, or anyone else, die faster. What it *will* do, is give you and your loved ones peace of mind. It is hard enough to lose those we love. Why make it harder by adding stress to an already extremely difficult situation? If you simply cannot bring yourself to have the conversation out loud, write it down and tell your loved ones where they can find all of the information. While you are at it, please include your full Hebrew name if you know it. I can’t tell you how many times finding that becomes a challenge. I promise, your family will thank you for all of this when you are no longer here.

Practically speaking, one of the first things to do is contact one of our area local funeral homes. I am happy to talk to you about this in order to offer any advice, or answer any questions, that you might have. Locally, our own synagogue has a lovely cemetery, Beth El cemetery, in Neptune. We are blessed to have Joanne Bass in our office who lovingly and expertly handles those arrangements with compassion and care; and a cemetery committee that maintains our cemetery, keeping the grounds beautiful and well cared for. And for those who would like a wonderful little book that talks about all of this and more, look for a small, very practical volume by Rusty Rosman entitled Two Envelopes: What You Want Your Loved Ones To Know When You Die.

My Uncle Arnold was the keeper of our family history. Uncle Arnold was someone who paid extremely close attention to detail. He knew the birth and death dates of every member of our family tree. As he was dying of cancer, and I called him to “say goodbye,” he said to me. “Now don’t worry. I have everything arranged... except, the time and place!” And so he did. And for that, we were all eternally grateful. I know that all of this is hard. But since we can never know the exact “time and place,” it is better to be prepared. Make the arrangements. You will be glad you did and so will those left behind to grieve and remember.
