OPENING AN OLD BOOK TO A NEW CHAPTER



A story is told of a young man from a wealthy family who was about to graduate from high school. It was the custom in that affluent neighborhood for the parents to buy the new graduate a car!

The young man and his father had spent months looking at cars, and the week before graduation, they found the perfect car. On the eve of his graduation, his father handed him a gift-wrapped Bible as a graduation present. The young man was so shocked and so angry that he slammed the Bible down on the table and stormed out of the house. He and his father never spoke again!

It was the news of his father's death that brought Bill home again, years later.

As he sat one night going through his father's possessions that he was to inherit, he came across the Bible that his father had given him. He brushed away the dust and opened it to find a cashier's check – dated the day of his graduation – in the exact amount of the car they had chosen together (Beckah Fink, americanrabbi.com).

What happens when we slam the door on something because we are sure that it is not what we want? What happens when we close ourselves off to something because we think it is "old," "dusty" or "irrelevant?" What happens is that we often lose out – big time.

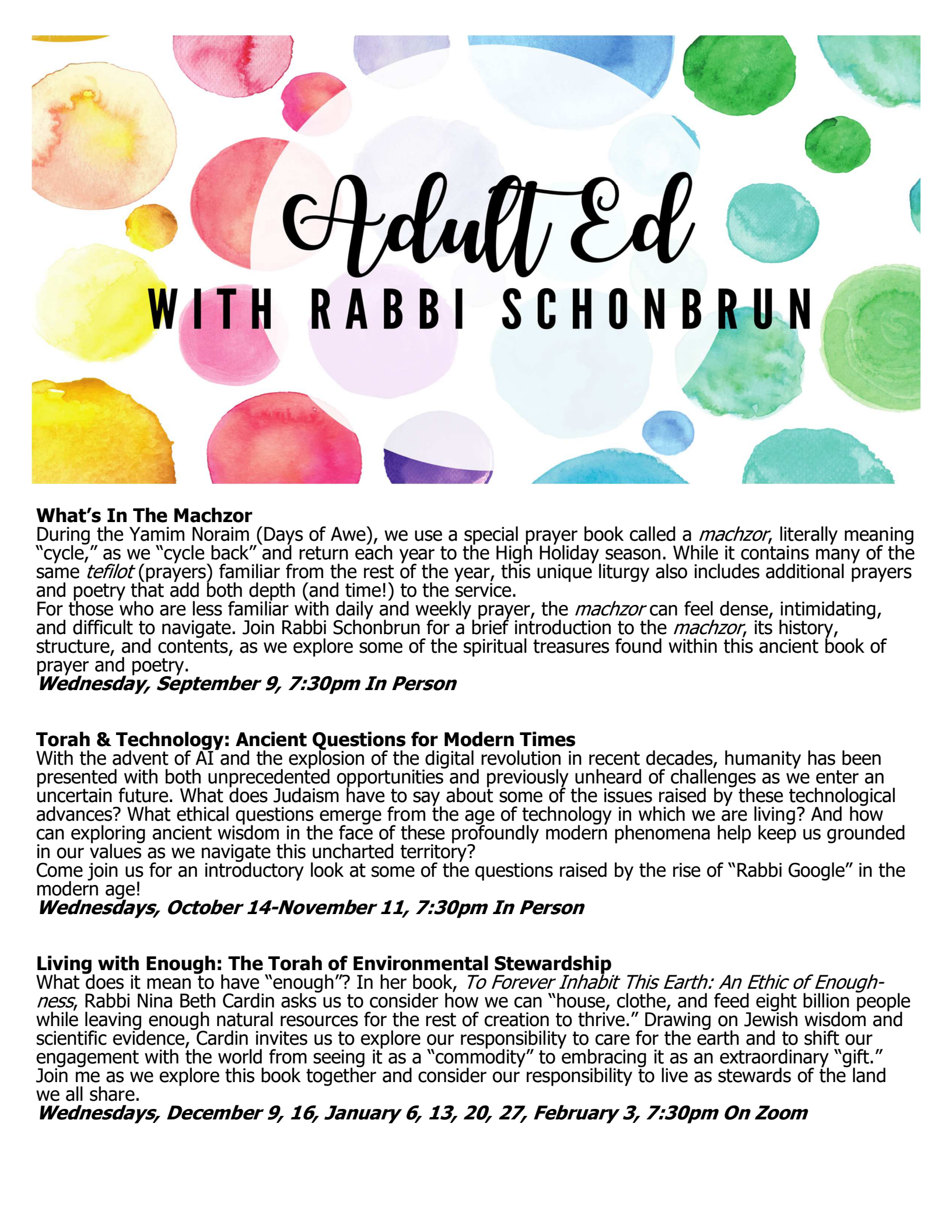
As we approach the final weeks of summer, I wonder how many of us have approached our Jewish lives in the way that this boy approached his graduation "gift." Judaism is an incredible gift (much better than a new car!), but it takes effort, time, patience and a reasonable amount of practice to gain a sense of spiritual depth and meaning that comes from Jewish life and living. But the first thing that it takes, is a willingness to open the book.

In a couple of weeks we will begin the month of Elul, four weeks during which we begin to "prepare" for the holidays that will soon be upon us. It is during Elul that we are to open our book, the book of our life, to see what we have learned, how we have grown, who we have wronged, where we might improve, and what might be missing from our lives as we begin a new year, a new chapter. This year, I am inviting you to "open the book" of your life again, to take a closer look at what is inside. In particular, take a moment to reflect on the incredibly generous and meaningful gift of Judaism that was given to you, and that may still be waiting to be welcomed into your heart once again.

Will this be the year that you cash in that most precious gift?

Ask yourselves: What am I looking for in my life right now, and how might my Judaism speak to what I am missing? What am I curious about when it comes to Jewish learning, life, and living, and where can I go to learn more? (*Hint: we are one answer to that question!*) What is it that pulls me back to synagogue in the first place each year, and what am I hoping to gain from that experience? What is one concrete thing that I am going to do this coming year to actively, proudly, and intentionally live my life as a Jew? Am I going to try to incorporate Shabbat into my life, kashrut or Jewish learning? Is this the year I am finally getting to Israel? Am I going to make it my business to listen to one Jewish podcast per week? Am I going to be the one to host a holiday dinner this year, volunteer for those in need? What am I going to do? How am I going to crack open the cover to my Jewish soul again to see what is inside? To help nurture something new inside. Because while these upcoming holidays are all about *teshuvah* in the sense of "forgiveness," they are also about *teshuvah* in the sense of renewal, and return. We are heading back into one of the most sacred seasons in our Jewish calendar. You are being called back home to open your Jewish book of life. It might take some dusting off, but it is right where you left it – waiting for you to turn the page.

What's In The Machzor

During the Yamim Noraim (Days of Awe), we use a special prayer book called a *machzor*, literally meaning "cycle," as we "cycle back" and return each year to the High Holiday season. While it contains many of the same *tefilot* (prayers) familiar from the rest of the year, this unique liturgy also includes additional prayers and poetry that add both depth (and time!) to the service.

For those who are less familiar with daily and weekly prayer, the *machzor* can feel dense, intimidating, and difficult to navigate. Join Rabbi Schonbrun for a brief introduction to the *machzor*, its history, structure, and contents, as we explore some of the spiritual treasures found within this ancient book of prayer and poetry.

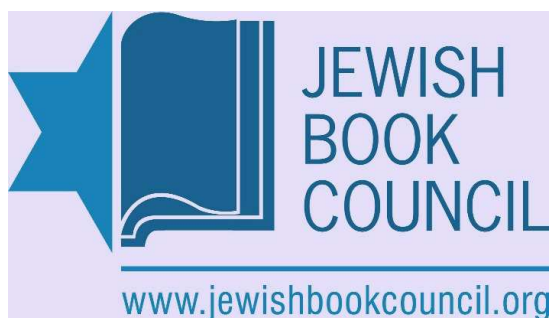

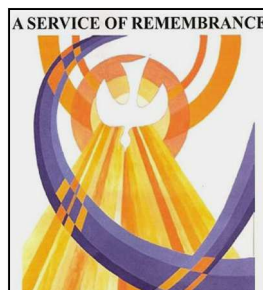
